

HELP FIGHT HUMAN TRAFFICKING

Many people want to help fight human trafficking but do not know how. Here are a few ideas.

- Learn the red flags that may indicate human trafficking and ask follow-up questions so you can help identify a potential trafficking victim. (See the Red Flags fact sheet.)
- Call the **National Human Trafficking Resource Center** at 1-888-373-7888 (24/7) or **Second Chance** in the Toledo area at 419-244-6050 to get help, report a tip with information on potential human trafficking activity, or learn more by requesting training, technical assistance or resources
- Meet with and write to your local, state and federal government representatives to let them know that you care about combating human trafficking in your community, and ask what they are doing to address human trafficking in your area.
- Volunteer to do victim outreach or offer your professional services to a local anti-trafficking organization.
- Organize a fundraiser and donate the proceeds to a local anti-trafficking organization.
- Host an awareness event to discuss human trafficking.
- Write a letter to the editor of your local paper about human trafficking in your community.
- Start or sign a human trafficking petition.
- Incorporate human trafficking information into your professional associations' conferences, trainings, manuals and other materials when appropriate.
- Set up a personal Google alert to receive current human trafficking news.
